DECLARATION OF PEACE OFFICERS IN TERMS OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ACT, 1977 (ACT NO. 51 OF 1977)

Under section 334 of the Criminal Procedure Act, 1977 (Act No. 51 of 1977), I -

- (a) under subsection (1) of that section, declare that every person who, by virtue of his or her office, falls within the category defined in Column 1 of the Schedule, in the area specified in Column 2 of the Schedule, be a peace officer for the purpose of exercising, with reference to the offences specified in column 3 of the Schedule, the powers defined in Column 4 of the Schedule;
- (b) under paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of that section, prescribe that the following must appear on the certificate of appointment referred to in subsection (2) of that section, issued to any person referred to in column 1 of the Schedule, namely:
 - (i) the full name of that person;
 - (ii) his or her identity number;
 - (iii) his or her signature;

- (iv) his or her photograph;
- (v) a description of the capacity in which he or she was appointed;
- (vi) the name of the minister which, subject to the approval of the Public Service Act, 1995 (Act No. 13 of 1995), made the designation; and
- (vii) the signature and official stamp of the employer or responsible person.
